As we look back to our 19th season, I am blown away by the leaps we took and what we accomplished:

- We remounted a new musical written for our students by award-winning playwright Krista Knight and composer Dave Malloy.
- We produced our second Alumni Project (formerly YMTC+), Fun Home, directed by alum Jacob Basri.
- We held our most successful gala to date, which along with our Together We Grow campaign raised close to \$175,000 (triple what we made in the previous year).
- We completed a rebranding project that culminated in a new name: Korsa Musical Theater.


Wow. We did all of this because of the profoundly generous and unflinching support from you: our incredible community. Thank you from the bottom of my heart.

- We have a line-up of four distinctly awesome shows at four distinctly awesome venues.

- We are launching our first-ever middle school production (grades 6-8), featuring all the training and adventure
 of our classic productions on a slightly smaller scale.
- We are calling for Korsa alumni to propose productions for the next Alumni Project in 2025-26

IMPACT STORY: alum & teaching artist


JACOB BASRI

Total student actors and apprentices: 112



Little Shop of Horrors: 1.5 students for every teaching artist



LOCATION BY COUNTY




YEAR IN SCHOOL




This season featured more college, gap year, and post-grad students than ever before, demonstrating Korsa's growing reputation as the premier training company for serious theater students.

RACE/ETHNICITY



This year's student body had the highest percentage yet of students who identified as more than one ethnicity or multiracial, reflecting demographic trends in the Bay Area.

TUITION ASSISTANCE and SCHOLARSHIPS



Total tuition budget: \$187,200 Total TA awarded: \$53,200 (28.4%)

This past season, **Korsa covered between 30-100% of tuition per applicant** for all 4 productions. TA is awarded on a sliding scale. Founders Scholarships and College Mentorships fully cover the cost of tuition. This season, we offered 3 Founders Scholarships and 11 College Mentorships.

OUTREACH

For the first time this year, we implemented a **free student ticket program** to reach out to students who may not otherwise get the chance to see one of our productions. Of over 30 schools reached, 13 participated, and **we gave away between 30 -100 tickets for each of our shows** this season. Some of the participating schools included Albany High School, College Preparatory School, Contra Costa School of the Performing Arts, Oakland School for the Arts, Saint Mary's College High School, and Skyline High School.

PRODUCTIONS

Little Shop of Horrors is iconic cult-classic botanical black comedy about love, murder, and selling out. This beloved and bloody musical comedy opened our season with a bang and left audiences howling with laughter.

One of the most beloved musicals of all time, *The Sound of Music* tells the inspiring story of love and art in the face of fear and hatred. Our cast featured students age 7–23, fostering an environment of peer-mentorship.

APPRENTICESHIPS





Theater Arts Apprenticeship Program

Now in its 10th year, our TAAP program serves students who want to study the behind-the-scenes aspects of stagecraft, gaining professional-level technical theater training through our productions. Many students continue to return show after show, sometimes honing their skills in the same department, and sometimes exploring new areas of stagecraft.

This season we offered apprenticeships in Directing, Music Directing, Stage Management, Choreography, Scenic, Props, Costumes, Hair & Make-Up, Sound, and Lighting.

Pit Orchestra Apprenticeship Program

Korsa invites qualified student instrumentalists to play in our Pit Orchestra Apprenticeship Program. POAP is tuition-free and a valuable learning experience for young musicians. Motivated students receive exceptional musical training and gain valuable experience playing alongside local professionals from the San Francisco Bay Area.

Our 2023-24 season saw several returning POAP students, demonstrating a **growing loyalty** to the program. We also saw a number of **new student instrumentalists** who had never played in a pit orchestra before. POAP students are paired with professional local musicians who are also music educators, giving them an **extra special and unique mentorship** that greatly enhances their experience.

LAURA CORNWALL






OUR FINANCES

This last fiscal year was a time of tremendous growth for Korsa, one that required a financial leap of faith. Our Board of Directors recognized that in order to move forward and pursue our dreams, the time was right to invest in growing our staff, even if it meant we would likely have a deficit year. We believe that investing in our people now will ultimately strengthen and grow our organization, both fiscally and programatically. Though this year's planned deficit is larger than we would have liked (thank you, inflation and ongoing pandemic-related challenges!), we will draw on some of our strategic financial reserves for the short term as we chart a path forward that allows us to continue to serve our students and community.
